

## WELCOME TO KNOX COLLEGE THEATRE

Welcome to the second mainstage production of Knox Theatre's 2014-15 season. We are excited to present the culmination of our collaboration with Jamil Khoury, Artistic Director of the

Chicago company Silk Road Rising.

My work with Jamil goes back to 2012, when I directed At Night's End, a new play written by Motti Lerner, that year's Visiting Israeli Scholar and an award-winning playwright and screenwriter. Silk Road Rising has staged several of Motti's plays, and he introduced me to Jamil and his partner Malik, and suggested we develop a play together. We decided to work on a project Jamil had already conceived and explored, a play inspired by the 2010 controversy surrounding the proposed building of a mosque near Ground Zero in New York. As Jamil explains in this playbill, he began with a unique online play development approach, inviting people from all around the world to serve as co-creators of Mosque Alert. We then continued that process on campus during the fall and winter terms. Knox appointed Jamil playwright-in-residence, and he visited campus twice in the fall, when we ran workshops in which students read and discussed scenes from the script in progress. We are grateful for the support Jamil's residency has received not only from the campus but also from the Illinois Arts Council Agency.

This term, Jamil returned to campus for auditions and first rehearsals, then again several weeks later. During that time, he's been continuing to edit the script, which has been exciting but also challenging for a cast that includes only two students who've previously appeared in a faculty-directed production. Jamil is also in residence this week, and will participate in a discussion after each performance. Civic engagement is central to Silk Road Rising's work, and we hope you will voice and debate your

responses to Mosque Alert.

## ABOUT SILK ROAD RISING

Silk Road Rising is a Chicago based non-profit theatre and media company that produces stage plays, video plays, and documentary films. By telling stories through primarily Asian American and Middle Eastern American lenses, Silk Road Rising is committed to advancing a polycultural worldview.

Founded in 2002 by life partners Malik Gillani and Jamil Khoury in response to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, Silk Road Rising understands the power of representation and the importance of shaping one's own representation. In countering negative and "otherizing" narratives about Asian, Middle Eastern and Muslim peoples with stories that are thoughtful, multi-faceted, and grounded in human experience, Silk Road Rising challenges colonial and Orientalist narratives, orthodoxies of identity politics, and theories purporting a "clash of civilizations." The term "Silk Road" refers to the historic trade routes that originated in China and extended across Central and South Asia, the Middle East, and into Europe, from the 2nd century B.C.E. until about the 16th century A.C.E. By envisioning a world that values art over ideology and inquiry over dogma, and creating space for feminist and queer voices within Silk Road communities, Silk Road Rising strives to advance change through cultural production.

## NOTES FROM PLAYWRIGHT JAMIL KHOURY

From lower Manhattan's Cordoba House (aka Park 51 aka "ground zero mosque") to Knox College's student production of "Mosque Alert," I have been on a whirlwind journey of discovering, decoding, and dramatizing resistance to the building of Muslim houses of worship and that pernicious triumvirate of public policy, racism, and zoning permits. But I never would've imagined that against the backdrop of ISIS and Chapel Hill, of Charlie Hebdo and a Texas fireman applauding the burning of a mosque, I'd find myself in Galesburg, Illinois working with a visionary director, Neil Blackadder, and some of the smartest, most thoughtful, honest, and engaged undergrads I've ever encountered.

What started as a series of student workshops, and a somewhat discombobulated "collection" of scenes I'd written, has culminated in the college world premiere of a play originally conceived as an online civic engagement and new play development project-"crowdsourced co-creating" meets the hallowed halls of academia. In other words, after releasing 24 character video blogs, nine virtual "conflict scenes," a digital compilation, 20,000+ online downloads, dozens of public presentations, angry walkouts, gracious applause, and hundreds of comments, posts, questions, shares, and private emails, I arrived at Knox College with characters, plot points, politics, and a story just waiting to congeal. And congeal it has. The play being staged in Harbach Theatre grows out of a uniquely collaborative process that has the culture and history of Knox College written all over it. Students spoke; faculty spoke; I spoke (and spoke and spoke); we listened, we exchanged, argued, debated, discovered, and ultimately, we created. The play may be set in Naperville, Illinois, but its themes of loyalty and betrayal, pluralism and prejudice, civil rights and personal fears, are themes that resonate universally. Today it's mosques that some fear. In yesteryears it was Catholic churches, Jewish synagogues, and Mormon Temples. Thus continues the cycle of expanding and redefining Americanness.

### WHO'S WHO IN THE CREATIVE TEAM

JAMIL KHOURY (Playwright) is Founding Artistic Director of Chicago's Silk Road Rising and the 2014 -15 Playwright-in-Residence at Knox College. A theatre producer, essayist, playwright, and film maker, Khoury's work focuses on Middle Eastern themes and questions of Diaspora. He is particularly interested in the intersections of culture, national identity, citizenship, and class. Khoury holds a M.A. degree in Religious Studies from The University of Chicago Divinity School and a B.S. degree in International Relations from Georgetown University 's School of Foreign Service. He is a Kellogg Executive Scholar (Kellogg School Management, Northwestern University) and has been awarded Certificate of Professional Nonprofit Achievement in Management. Khoury is the 2013 recipient of the Actor's Equity Association's Kathryn V. Lamkey Award for promoting diversity and inclusion in theatre, the 2013 recipient of the Change Maker Award from South Asian Americans Leading Together (SAALT) for advancing antiracist civic engagement, and the 2010 recipient of the 3Arts Artist Award for Playwriting. Khoury thanks Knox College, Neil Blackadder, and the entire cast and production team of Mosque Alert for a truly extraordinary experience.

NEIL BLACKADDER (Director) has taught at Knox since 1998, in the areas of dramatic literature and theatre history, dramaturgy, and playwriting. *Mosque Alert* is the

twelfth show he has directed or codirected in Harbach, ranging from Molière, Schiller, and Chekhov to the world premiere of Motti Lerner's At Night's End. In 2008, he directed the English-language world premiere of his own translation from German of Rebekka Kricheldorf's Rosa and Blanca. Neil's translations have also been produced professionally in the UK and US and recognized with many grants and residencies including from PEN, the Howard Foundation, and the Banff Centre. Neil grew up and went to university in England, and first came to the US for graduate study in Comparative Literature. He is the author of Performing Opposition: Modern Theater and the Scandalized Audience, and of the short play "Dad's Guns," published in the collection 24 Gun Control Plays.

#### CRAIG CHOMA

(Scenic & Lighting Designer/ Technical Director/Videographer) is an Associate Professor of Theatre at Knox College (resident designer and technical director). Favorite Knox designs include The Caffe Cino Project, In The Next Room (or the vibrator play), Next Fall, The Green Bird, Caucasian Chalk Circle, Under Construction, Twelfth Night, A Lie of The Mind, Medea, Angels in America, Intimate Apparel, Rosa & Blanca, The Skriker, Noises Off, A Moon for the Misbegotten, As You Like It, The Grapes of Wrath, War and Peace, Arcadia, and Macbeth. MARGO SHIVELY (Costume Designer) began her career in the fashion industry after graduating from the the Art Institute of Chicago. She interned with Oleg Cassini and designed and freelanced for several years before coming to Knox to teach costume design. In her thirty years at Knox, Margo has designedmore frequently co-designed with students- a number of plays. She has also designed for the Black Hills Playhouse in Custer, South Dakota and is a regular designer and consultant for Vitalist Theatre Company in Chicago, where she has been actively involved since its first production of The Mill On The Floss in 1997. She is an active member of the U.S. Institute for Theatre Technology, participating in symposiums on design and curriculum across the country.
