

WELCOME TO KNOX COLLEGE THEATRE

Welcome to the third and final mainstage production of the Department of Theatre's 2014-15 season. It's been an unusual year, beginning with *The Caffe Cino Project* for which we built a reconstruction of a New York coffeehouse in Studio, and continuing with last term's college world premiere of a new play by Jamil Khoury, *Mosque Alert*. The season ends with Jeff Grace's production of a play we scheduled to coincide with his teaching our popular Women Playwrights class, in which 22 students are enrolled this term. Gina Gionfriddo's *Rapture*, *Blister*, *Burn* was named as one of two runner-ups for the 2013 Pulitzer Prize in Drama; the Pulitzer board described it as "A searing comedy that examines the psyches of two women in midlife as they ruefully question the differing choices they have made."

The rehearsal process for each term's faculty-directed show always take place alongside those for several productions in Studio Theatre (and sometimes in other spaces on campus). This term has been a special one in Studio, in that all the work presented in reading and productions - over six weekends - has been student-written as well as student-directed, including two presentations in connection with year-long Honors Projects.

Each year the audiences for our productions in Harbach and Studio number over three thousand. And the students who participate in those shows come from across the academic disciplines, represent all four class-years, and annually number approximately 400. The faculty is proud of the work we present, and we look forward to seeing you next year, when the season will include Repertory Term XVII, and our second New Plays Festival.

THE PLAYWRIGHT



Gionfriddo an **J**award-winning playwright and accomplished television writer. Her play Rapture, Blister, Burn was a finalist for the 2013 Pulitzer Prize in Drama. The play had a twice-extended run Off Broadway at Playwrights Horizons in 2012, and recently successful productions had at the Hampstead Theatre in London and the Goodman Chicago. Theatre in Gionfriddo's play Becky Shaw, also a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in Drama (2009), enjoyed a long

run Off Broadway at Second Stage (Outer Critics Circle Award) and in London at the Almeida Theatre where it received two Evening Standard Award nominations. Her other plays include Guinevere (O'Neill Playwrights' Conference); U.S. Drag (Clubbed Thumb); After Ashley (Vineyard Theatre, Obie Award); and the one-acts Squalor and America's Got Tragedy (commissioned by the stageFARM). Ms. Gionfriddo has received a Guggenheim Fellowship in Playwrighting, as well as the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, the Helen Merrill Award for Emerging Playwrights, and an American Theatre Critics Association/Steinberg citation. She has worked as a writer and producer for "Law & Order" and "Law & Order: Criminal Intent," and as a writer for "Cold Case," "The Borgias," and "House of Cards." She has contributed essays on rock music to the literary journal The Believer, and short fiction to Canteen. Ms. Gionfriddo is a graduate of Barnard College and Brown University's MFA playwriting program. She has taught at Brown University, Rhode Island College, and Providence College.
