

Director's Note:

This play was originally written in 1963 (baraka still used the name LeRoi Jones at the time) and it was first performed in 1964. As students, we know the political and social significance of this time period within U.S. history, and we are seeing this history repeat itself in many ways as hate and fear continue to impact ourlives. *Dutchman* addresses some of these issues that are still relevant and pervasive in our society in both literal and metaphorical ways. I was motivated to direct this play (and to place it in a more recent time period) because it is still applicable today regardless of when it was written.

Admittedly, directing this play was not an easy decision. Dutchman uses language that is hateful, but it is still used by some. We, as Dutchman's cast and production team, have sat down and agreed to leave this language in our production of the play. We do not condone general use of some language. We hope to draw attention to its use in society within history, as well as present day, and we hope to cause you to reflect on the power of such language. Parts of this show are ugly, and it should be difficult to witness. As a campus, we try to impact the world in a beneficial way, and that often begins with asking for or demanding change. This play is an attempt to do so. Additionally, I feel that we often hear when others speak, but we do not always choose to listen. People will always say and do things that we don't like, but ignoring those things will not cause them to cease existing. I hope to start a conversation that will help us to learn and grow as a community.
